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Message from the President By Paulo Cesar

Dear ADM Members,

The ADM Board is going through very busy times with the organization of the 2018 Meeting, revision of the contract with Elsevier, creation of an institutional investment strategy, redesigning of our website, among other issues. One important issue is the communication between the ADM Executive Board and general membership of our Academy. In the past, we sent out newsletters on a regular basis, but for some reason we stopped doing this. A newsletter with updated information is long overdue and we decided to reinstate this tradition.

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We had a very successful ADM meeting in October 2016. Ana Bedran-Russo organized a wonderful meeting at the Drake Hotel in Chicago, USA. Nine international opinion leaders even from outside the dental field provided a deep insight in the different



themes, including "a fresh look at natural biomaterials and interfaces", "innovation in dental materials development and performance biocompatibility considerations for novel materials" and "challenges faced by materials in the various oral microenvironments". At this conference, we introduced the "Meet the Industry" format, in which we gave space to our platinum sponsors to present their perspective on dental materials.

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Message from the President

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In 2016, we had a major change in our Executive Board, as our long-term treasurer Tom Hilton decided it was time to transition his position to another colleague. Tom joined the Executive board in 2002 and became



treasurer in 2004. During his twelve years of service as treasurer, the ADM steadily grew to become a financially sound society! We would like to express our appreciation to Tom for all his encouragement and leadership! At the ADM meeting in Chicago, Carmem Pfeifer took over the duties and responsibilities as our new treasurer.

Our 2017 annual meeting was held from October 5-7 in Nuremberg, Germany. The overall theme of the conference was "Material Development: From Benchtop to Clinic" with a first day on "Material Characterization", followed by a day on "Functional Behavior", and a last day on "Clinical Performance". Locally organized by Ulrich Lohbauer, the oral presentations were given by eleven international experts in the field. The success



of the meeting was reflected by the significant number of 268 attendees coming from 37 different countries. Some impressions can still be found at www.adm-conference.com. At this meeting, we introduced the regional "Student Travel Award", dedicated to the five major regions: North America, Latin America, Europe, Asia/Middle East, Asia/Pacific Region.

Deanna Hilton, our long-term Executive Manager decided to retire from this position by the end of 2018. Dea Dea diligently managed this role over 14 years. She was always the backbone and the brain of the Academy and the Executive Board very much relied on her effective and competent support. She was also the first contact for all members and all inquiries. We will miss her and would like to wish her good luck in her personal future!

DeaDea very seriously took care of her successor and recommended RES Seminars (www.res-inc.com) as a professional management company for the Academy.

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She introduced Lynn Reeves as a new contact person at RES. The ADM Board of Directors signed a four- year contract with RES starting in 2018. Due to the manifold duties of the executive manager, 2018 will be a transition year in which DeaDea and Lynn will be working together, transferring all ADM businesses to RES. We are looking forward to working with RES in the management of the ADM!



During the Business meeting in Nuremberg, the financial investment plan involving about half of the ADM current assets was presented to the membership. Discussion and concerns have been raised related to the general investment policy as well as to practical support versus investment options. The ADM Executive Board has created a financial advisory committee (FAC) which has undertaken an extensive analysis and argumentation for investment. The primary goal of the investment strategy is to achieve financial growth that can be returned as

sustainable benefits to the ADM membership. Respective documents can be downloaded in the secure members-only area of the ADM website. Any comments from ADM Members are welcome!

As you might have recognized, the ADM website received several refreshing features, including the secure members-only area with a new Find-a-Member tool and the connection to the new 2018 conference website (www.admconference.com). Currently under construction, the website will receive a new responsive, mobile friendly interface as well as some new organizational features at the backend.

Since last October, I have been working diligently with Roberto Braga to prepare our Annual Meeting in Brazil. The good news is that we were able to attract 16 sponsors to support the meeting (Kulzer, Elsevier, Sulzer, Vita, DMG, Ultradent, Bisco, Ivoclar Vivadent, Kerr, Pulpdent, Bien Air, Dentsply Sirona, Shofu, 3M, Colténe and FGM). I would like to thank all board members who helped me with this, especially Ulrich Lohbauer, Rick Carvalho and Ana Karina Bedran-Russo. Dea Dea Hilton and Carmem Pfeifer were also very helpful in this process.

RES prepared a new website for our annual meeting, which is almost ready and looks very nice. The website is compatible with smartphones and tablets and will be directly connected to our registration and abstract submission platforms.

We are expecting a high attendance at this annual meeting, especially from Brazilian researchers, of course. Dental Materials Editors' Report

So far this year (to week 40, 2017) we have received 715 new submitted manuscripts – approximately 18 per week. If this rate is sustained to year-end it will mean total submissions of 930 MSS; more than a 16 % increase over 2016. Despite the clear message that our focus is on (bio)materials science for dentistry, we receive some MSS that have little connection with either field, even though many of these papers appear to be of a high scientific standard. We are constantly reassessing what constitutes the content and boundaries of our field in the 21st century.

The support from Elsevier continues to be excellent, both from our Senior Publisher: Jane Ryley and the Journal Manager: Matthieu Renaud. The latest Journal Citation Reports (for 2016; released June 2017) were particularly encouraging. The Dent Mater IF is 4.070 and the 5-year IF is 5.155 – this is higher than any other dental journal (of the 90 listed). We had 11,915 citations. We are also top of Elsevier's Citescore Index (4.74) for all of their 28 dental journals and every other dental journal.

This year we had many of the ADM Research Guidance papers accepted and published. The speaker Manuscripts for the 2016 ADM meeting in Chicago were published at intervals this year, with one default. Also the majority of speaker manuscripts for the Nuremberg meeting have now been received

and typeset. So many will be available for the January 2018 issue: 34(1).

We also published a number of Review papers, for which we require prior approval before submission. Some proposed reviews were declined, because a high standard is expected - not a first attempt at a literature review by a novice researcher. Moreover, there is a problem of inappropriately conceived review topics through misapplication of Cochrane-type criteria to issues in restorative biomaterials, for which they are unsuitable. This problem was addressed recently by Prof J-F Roulet in a Guest Editorial.

We now have 12 months experience with manuscript operating the Elsevier management platform, known as EVISE, which replaced the previous system (EES) in September 2016. EVISE has recently gone through a series of revision updates, entailing periods of downtime. The new system has greater functionality, although there are some things that editorially we could do previously that we cannot so easily do now. EVISE is now becoming common to all the Elsevier journals, publishing - as they do - 25 % of global research papers.

The Editorial Team expresses grateful thanks for their support to the ADM President, ADM Board members and the journal Editorial Board – David Watts & Nick Silikas.

the Editor-in-Chief of our Journal Dental Materials since 1998 and raised the impact to 4.040 in 2017, which made it the leading dental journal.

Latin America: Diego Santos Manarão (Brazil): Silica-coating of Y-TZP before final sintering: Monoclinic content

North America: No application received.

ADM Guidance Initiative

Back in 2013, the ADM Board established a scientific initiative towards proper guidance for dental materials research. The principal motivation was to address this to young or new researchers in the field, beyond what is available in the ISO specifications and other literature reviews. It should further help standardizing inter-lab research and


