

Academy of Dental Materials October 2-5, 2019

JACKSON HOLE, WY USA

The stunning landscape of Jackson Hole (Wyoming, USA) hosted the 2020 Annual Meeting between October 3 and 5. 171 participants 19 different countries gathered together in the magnificent venue at Four Season.



The main theme of the conference was "Materials To Enable The Evolution -Revolution Of Digital Dentistry" with a first day dedicated to "Digital dentistry", a second day focused on "Emerging developments in active materials" and the last one to "3D Printing, CAD/CAM machining", with ten international experts invited to give their oral presentations and publish the related papers in Dental Materials.



The meeting was characterized by a novel split presentation format allotted to Dianne Rekow at the beginning and end of the program to both introduce the topic of digital dentistry and then forecast where it may lead us. Moreover, for the first time, the Marshall Award finalists gave a three-minute thesistype oral presentation of their work, introduced by a team presentation by Sally and Grayson Marshall during the program.

We continued the tradition of Breakfast & Learning, followed by a successful "Meet Industry Session" at the beginning of the meeting day on Friday and Saturday.



Financially, the Academy is in good shape. The net assets have increased \$41,913 from 2017 to 2018.

The ADM financial advisory committee has been charged with setting up a means to fund relatively small project proposals among our membership. To accomplish this, we have received approval to move up to \$350K from our reserves into an interest-bearing money market or related account. The idea is that the interest income would defray some of the

expenses of funding these projects.

The current environment is not the most favorable it has been in recent years in terms of potential interest rates, but we have elected not to pursue the riskier and more labor intensive investment in the stock and bond market, but rather opted for low risk options. The committee is looking into splitting the single savings account into a liquid and a 1 year (maybe 2 year) money market account. It would most likely all be within a single banking/savings institution.

Dental Materials Editors' Report

Support from Elsevier continues to be excellent, both from our Senior Publisher: Jane Ryley and the Journal Manager: Matthieu Renaud. All print issues have been published on time.

All Speaker Manuscripts from the 2018 ADM meeting in Brazil have been published, apart from one that was not submitted.

In mid-July, Elsevier introduced a new Editorial Manager system (EM) for all its journals to replace EVISE.

Submission rates: The average of new submitted manuscripts is >20 per week.

Acceptance rate: 22-23% for full-length articles and 22-38% for reviews (2017-18).

Character of submissions: Our general impression is that the standard of submissions, especially at the "top end" of the distribution is rising, with some really outstanding manuscripts. However, there is still a "lower end" to the distribution where the quality of presentation is poor.

There has been an increase in the proportion of reviews offered on unsuitable topics. Such review offers have been declined and reasons given. Many of the invited papers published from ADM meetings go on to be very well cited.

Citation Scores and IF: The Journal's 2018 CiteScore has increased from 4.74 in 2017 to 5.05 as of June 2019 reflecting a 12% increase year over year. This places the journal #1 out of 111 in 'General Dentistry' journals and slightly ahead of JDR (5.04). 91% of the articles have been cited (compared to 84% for JDR).

Dental Material's Impact Factor has increased to 4.440, placing the journal in the top three in the Dentistry, Oral Surgery and Medicine category.

Reproduction of Accepted Manuscripts:

For many PhD candidates, with publications in Dent Mater, it is common to receive requests to authorize reproduction of their paper in their thesis. We advise that – for legal and copyright reasons - they should not incorporate final versions of their MSS, as typeset and published by Elsevier.

Instead it is OK to incorporate the Word or PDF version of their MSS, as accepted by the Editor.

The Editorial Team expresses grateful thanks for their support to the ADM President, ADM Board members and the journal Editorial Board – David Watts & Nick Silikas. ■
