This is a very busy and exciting time for the Academy and I hope that this newsletter will inform all of our fellows and members of recent and future activities. For further information on any item, please contact the person responsible for the activity. Names and addresses are at the end of the newsletter.

#### 1. Journal

The Academy will soon own our official journal, Dental Materials. We have verbally agreed to purchase the title and the non-member subscription list from Munksgaard, although the final documents have not been signed. We contacted four potential publishers, and the IADR/AADR will become our new publisher beginning with volume 5, in 1989, initially for three years. Dr. Frank Young is working with Linda Hemphill of the IADR to finalize format and to plan the first issues. The journal will be published 6 times per year, beginning in January, 1989, and each issue will be 72 pages long. increased length and a change in format should reduce the current backlog of papers and result in shorter publication time. The subscription rates will be \$50 for ADM members (included in dues), \$145 for non-members, and \$85 for IADR members. (This represents a considerable savings for the Academy since nearly all of our \$85 dues currently goes to pay for the journal). The mailing of the journal will be by surface mail initially. If you do not receive your journals in good condition within 2 months of the date of the issue, please contact me and we will make other arrangements.

## 2. Future Meetings

a) October 6-8, 1988 Holiday Inn, Gaithersburg, MD. Conference on Modern Instrumentation and Analysis Techniques. Co-sponsored by National Bureau of Standards. The conference is designed to provide dental materials researchers with an introduction to a variety of modern instruments and analysis techniques. Brochures describing the conference were sent to all our members in May. Two errors appeared in the brochure regarding the poster session on Saturday, October 8. Any dental materials topic may be included, and a two-page abstract should be submitted to Dr. de Rijk for publication in the Transactions. Further information can be obtained from Dr. John Tesk (scientific program) or Kathy Kilmer (meeting arrangements).

- b) February 16-17, 1989, ADA, Chicago, IL. Computer Aided Processing of Materials in Dentistry. Dr. Stephen Bayne and Dr. E. Dianne Rekow are the program co-chairs and have been planning an exciting CAD-CAM session, including a hands-on demonstration. The annual business meeting of the ADM will be held the evening of February 16th, along with a conference dinner. The scientific session will be on February 17th. Further information can be obtained from Dr. Bayne.
- c) June 26-28, 1989, Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland. Correlation Between In Vitro and In Vivo Performance of Dental Materials. This meeting is sponsored jointly by the ADM, Dental Materials Group of IADR and ICI Dental. ICI Dental will be providing the financial support for the meeting. The scientific program has been organized by Drs. Tom Roberts and John McCabe.

- d) November 2-4, 1989, East-West Center, University of Hawaii, Honolulu. International Congress of Dental Materials Joint Meeting of ADM & JSDMD. This meeting will include a broad spectrum of dental materials, and major presentations will pair speakers from the Academy and the JSDMD on each topic. - e) (February 15-16, 1990) Chicago. Enamel-Dentin-Bone-PDL Interactions with Dental Materials (Dr. Hugo Retief, program chairman).

This meeting is in the early planning stages.

d) Paffenbarger Award: The Paffenbarger Award honors the student with the best paper in <u>Dental Materials</u> for the year. Because of confusion in determining student status of the authors of papers, the 1987 award has been delayed; awards will be presented at the 1989 Annual Meeting for both 1987 and 1988. The outstanding papers will be selected from those published during the year of the award. More information can be obtained from Dr. Robert Erickson.
