Aloha from the Second International Congress on Dental Materials! This second congress sponsored jointly by the Academy of Dental Materials and the Japanese Society for Dental Materials and Devices was held November 1-4,



1993 at the East-West Conference Center of the University of Hawaii, Honolulu. Scientists from all over the world attended in greater numbers than at the first congress held in 1989. The numbers of abstracts submitted also increased; there was a total of 192, which included 52 oral presentations and 140 poster presentations. The seminar, entitled "Information Exchange: Current Technology of Dental Materials", featured a variety of presentations by both ADM and JSDMD speakers on dental materials topics including composites, bonding technology, glass ionomers, titanium casting and more. All seminar presentations, as well as the poster and oral presentations, were held during the mornings of the conference; the afternoons were left open for the participants to enjoy the beautiful sights and the tropical climate of Hawaii. The meeting headquarters, the Hilton Hawaiian Village, was also the site of the conference banquet, a dinner show featuring the singer/dancer Charo.

The Paffenbarger Award winner was named as part of the conference activities; this year's winner was A.M. El Araby. Transactions of the meeting were produced and distributed to those in attendance. Copies of the Transactions will be sent to ADM members who did not attend.

The success of the Second International Congress was due to the wonderful efforts made by many people from both the ADM and from the JSDMD. Because of this success, a lot of participants indicated that they would like to see a Third International Congress take place in 1997.

Status of Dental Materials

Six issues of the journal were published in 1993. However, the year started off behind and we have been struggling to catch up. We really appreciate

your patience and will continue our diligent efforts to get manuscripts processed as quickly as possible and the journal back on schedule. Unlike other journals, we do not have a cut off date for authors to return accepted manuscripts that needed slight revisions. In order to avoid more rules and regulations, please recognize the vital importance of returning accepted manuscripts and page proofs as quickly as possible to avoid delaying production of the upcoming issues.

If your manuscript is not returned by the editor's office within three months, it is probably due to one of two reasons. Either the reviewers did not submit their critique in a timely manner or there was a split decision and the manuscript was sent out for a third review. We are in the process of computerizing our records and soon will be able to make more accurate predictions about the quality and timeliness of reviewers. We also hope to get the editorial board more actively involved in the reviewing process with the goal that their energetic participation will speed up the process.

The propitious report by the Journal Review Committee was encouraging (see Vol. 9 No. 4). We want to thank the Chairman, Jack Ferracane, and the other committee members, Eugene Huget, Fred Rueggeberg, and Nikhil Sarkar, for the time and effort they spent in evaluating the 1992 issues of *Dental Materials*. Dr. Sarkar has agreed to serve as chair for the team that will evaluate the journal published in 1993. If you have comments or suggestions about the evaluation process please let him know.

In an effort to get the journal out on a timely basis, we have been publishing one issue every month. However to accelerate the time table, the last two issues of 1993, Vol. 9 No. 5 and Vol. 9 No. 6 will be combined as they were in 1992. This issue will be mailed by the end of March. In the following months, you should expect to receive the first issues of Vol. 10. Once again thank you for your patience.
