

Annual Meeting 2022

After two years of virtual meetings during the pandemic time, ADM held the first in-person annual meeting from September 28 through October 1 in 2022 in Athens/Greece. The event featured nine world-class speakers focused on "Progress in Dental Materials and Digital Engineering ". World wide interest in the ADM continues to expand, and we welcomed two hundred seventy-eight participants representing 36 different countries in beautiful Athens.

The first day of the meeting focused on adhesive technologies starting with the presentation of Dr Afshin Falsafi, followed by the Dr Kumiko Yoshihara who provided a great overview on the role of functional monomers in adhesion. After the poster session, the program continued with

short presentations of three Marshall Postdoctoral award finalists. First day closed with Dr Silke Christianssen's presentation on the use of advanced imaging technologies and machine learning approaches with the focus on ceramic materials.



The second day of the meeting started with the meet-the-industry session. During this session Prof Jungi Tagami enlightened the audience on the bioactive technologies and innovation of Giomer/S-PRG fillers and its impact on minimal invasive dentistry. Following this session, morning session of the second day focused on ceramics. Prof Edgar Zanotto provided an excellent overview on the past, present and future of glass ceramics, and shared his experience on the use of artificial intelligence in ceramic designs. His presentation was followed Dr Tanja Lube's inspiring presentation on 3D printed ceramics and effect of testing environments on the reported properties. Prof Ralf Kohal concluded the second day with his excellent

presentation on oral implants made from zirconia materials with the focus on their potentials and limitations.

The last day of the meeting focused on the engineering of the new materials. Dr. Carmen Pfeifer focused on the current trends in polymeric materials utilizing host and bacterial enzymemediated approaches, Dr. Conrado Apraicio provided a comprehensive overview of the peptides and bioinstructive polymers for prevention of oral infections and the session concluded with Dr. Spiro Megremis presentation on the various aspects of product development and regulatory processes. Altogether, this exciting program was completed with nine invited research talks, one meet-the-industry talk and three Marshall Award finalists' presentations. The participants could also enjoy the latest findings and progress in dental materials research by viewing over 170 posters that were presented by our members during the poster sessions. Once again it was a very rich and inspiring program that addressed the latest development of materials in dentistry.

The social dinner with a beautiful view of the Acropolis was fully subscribed and provided an excellent opportunity to continue networking while enjoying delicious Greek cuisine.

Treasurer's Report By Carmem Pfeifer

Summary of Finances and membership

1. Financially, the Academy is still in good shape. The net assets have increased by \$64,535 to date (from \$848,984 to \$913,518 in 2022). The total assets line reflects the values as of December 31 each year (calendar year totals) all expenses have been matched against the assets, which only happens after the annual meeting.

3. The final accounting for the 2022 annual meeting held in Greece was: Income: \$158,424 (sponsorship: \$67,500; registration \$89,869; Expenses: \$129,816, resulting in a surplus of \$28,608. The total number of registrations was 278, with 233 paid attendees.

4. Progress of the FAC activities: the process to invest \$450,000 into a fixed income brokerage account on Wells Fargo has been completed on 5/11/2022, and the account has grown to \$460,131 as of February 8, 2023.

5. This was the second year of the Bowen early career investigator award, for a total of \$20,000 in sponsorship. Applications were reviewed by 2-3 reviewers each. Since the 2021 awardee was unable to accept the award due to conflict with another funding agency policy, and since we have had surplus from the 2021 budget, we have awarded two grants in 2022.

From the Editorial Office By David Watts and Nick Silikas

There have been some further changes in Elsevier staff who have responsibilities for *Dental Materials*. Our *Senior Publisher* since February is now Ms. **Lindsay Allen**, who is based in Philadelphia. She was not in attendance in Athens but will attend the 2023 ADM meeting. We were able to send a memento gift to her predecessor, Jane Ryley, which was much appreciated. Jake Hurley is now well-established as our *Journal Manager*, based in Exeter UK. Thanks to his good offices, issues of the journal were published each month in 2022. However, currently only 94 print copies are mailed per issue. This makes advertising *in print issues* quite costly in terms of impact.

Manuscript submission rates remain at a high level (about 14/week) and we continue to prioritize original (experimental) research papers over review papers, the latter being very carefully selected from numerous proposals. In many areas within our field, real advances in understanding can only be achieved by well-conceived and controlled experiments that address *very focused original questions*, given the huge number of potential variables. Effective review papers normally require the authors to have extensive prior experience in experimental research publications *on the precise topic in question*.

There has been a further increase in Impact *Factor* from 5.304 to **5.687**, ranking it 7 out of 92 in Dentistry, Oral Surgery and Medicine. The CiteScore is now 9.2 (3/109 for Dentistry). The journal is indexed in 32 international databases. Most papers are published on a Subscription *basis* – without publication charge and are freely available to subscribers (particularly ADM Members) as well as developing countries and patient groups through Elsevier access programs. However, despite the high costs (now risen by 10%), there was a small but significant increase (to 22 out of 193) in Gold Open Access (GOA) papers in 2021. Some have been facilitated through universities arranging specific finitetime 'deals' with Elsevier where the universities pay the GOA costs for their staff. GOA articles feature notably amongst the most downloaded articles and are also prominent amongst most cited articles.

The Transactions from the ADM 2021 virtual meeting (including all categories of Abstracts) appeared online in the Journal as issue **38S**. But we did not receive any speaker manuscripts from the 2021 virtual meeting. For the ADM 2022 meeting, we had 216 Abstracts submitted. 160 have been accepted as general posters, 6 for the Marshall Awards and 7 for the Paffenbarger Awards.

There is now a new system operated by Elsevier who will make tailored 'transfer' offers for MSS rejected by *Dental Materials* for other than (eg) ethical reasons. This is being operated by a *Scientific Managing Editor* (SME) internal to Elsevier. Their average turnaround time for an offer is 24 - 48 h.

We have, for the time being, declined a further offer from Elsevier to facilitate 'Special Issues' (SIs). The decision was based on: (i) the finite pool of outstanding articles submitted each year; (ii)uncertainties about additional costs* to the Academy; (iii) the risk of diluting our IF performance;(iv) the fact that the field of Dental Materials – though multidisciplinary – is relatively coherent. *The cost for sponsoring a standard **Text Article Supplement** would be \$1200/page (print and online *or* online-only) with a 32-page billable minimum of \$38,400 (plus applicable tax).

Dr. Elizabeth Dianne Rekow († August 11, 2022)

Our ADM fellow, emeritus member, Elizabeth Dianne Rekow (1944-2022) died Aug. 11. She was an exceptional person and leader in dental research and contributed to our meetings both by her active presence and also with the keynote presentations, latest one at the Jackson Hole meeting in 2019

She was a professor emeritus and fellow at King's College London, where she served as executive dean of Dental Institute and professor of orthodontics from 2012-16. She previously worked at New York University, where she was

a professor of orthodontics, senior vice provost of engineering technology and provost of the Polytechnic Institute.

Her early career as an engineer and her interest in the potential of CAD/CAM technologies for biomedical applications guided her to pursue a degree in dentistry and later a PhD and also an MS and certificate in orthodontics. Throughout her career she succeeded as a leader, significantly contributed to the development of digital dentistry, and over the years, became a leading voice for the future of dentistry. Her professional contributions included patents, many publication, numerous book contributions as well over 100 national and international as presentations.

Throughout her career, she was a strong role model and a mentor for women in science and actively supported women in their careers over the years.

She will be truly missed.
